### **Sabatino Vacca Music Director**

Sabatino Vacca has been the Music Director of the Cambridge Symphony Orchestra since 2007. His talent, charisma, and creativity has helped to craft inspiring programming and brought talented guests into performances. In addition to his role with the CSO, Sabatino has helped found the Milton Philharmonic Orchestra in 2014 and is the Founder, Artistic Director, and Chorus Master of the newly formed Southern Ontario Lyric Opera (SOLO).

## Joy Schuster Concertmaster

Joy is an experienced musician and teacher who brings skill and energy to the CSO. In 2022 Joy received the Bernice Adams Memorial award for her contributions to the artistic and cultural life of Cambridge. Most recently, Joy was awarded the King Charles the III Coronation Medal by the City of Guelph. Joy's remarkable contributions to Canada can be heard in the music of our community and beyond.





### Cathy Gallagher Orchestra Manager

Originally from Dublin, Cathy has performed with top ensembles across Ireland and Canada. A clarinetist with a music performance degree from Dublin and advanced studies in Montréal, she's played with the Irish Youth Wind Ensemble, Milton Philharmonic, and Southern Ontario Lyric Opera. Cathy joined the CSO in 2023 and became Orchestra Manager in 2024. Her creative talents extend into photography and graphic design and Cathy has been generous with her time and talents redesigning the CSO website and helping with programme designs.





# Cambridge Symphony Orchestra Income Sources



Ticket sales account for only approximately 40% of the total income required to operate the Cambridge Symphony Orchestra (CSO). This underscores the critical importance of other revenue sources, including donations and sponsorships, to sustain our operations and artistic programming.

When compared to other orchestras registered with Orchestras Canada, the CSO receives significantly less in donations than the national average for Canadian symphony orchestras. This analysis highlights an opportunity to grow philanthropic support as a vital part of the CSO's funding model.
